A Letter from Bishop Greg Bennet to Parishioners

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

At this weekend's Masses you will learn about the establishment of our new Diocesan Mission Council. This exciting initiative is a significant step in our response to Pope Francis' invitation to become a more synodal and missionary Church. The Synod on Synodality is now underway in Rome. There is a sense of anticipation as Pope Francis now gathers with delegates from around the world in truly walking as sisters and brothers in the Lord through prayer, listening, and discernment as they reflect communion, participation, and mission in Jesus Christ. It is my hope the Mission Council will assist me in investigating, discerning, and proposing practical priorities and strategies for the development of the Diocese's mission and pastoral life. The work of the Mission Council will be to model coresponsibility of ministries, charisms in service of good governance and pastoral life.

As you hear about the Diocesan Mission Council today, I hope you may feel the same energy and excitement that I share for this wonderful initiative which continues the great legacy of our Diocesan Assembly, which embrace the Decrees of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia and in dynamic response to the work of the international Synod.

I am inviting you to prayerfully consider whether you have the gifts required to express your interest to serve on the Mission Council. You might wish to encourage another member of your parish community whose Christian witness and service to the Church would enrich the work of the Diocesan Mission Council by their positive engagement.

My hope is that we will receive Expressions of Interest from many parishioners across our Diocese, which encompasses the large growth corridor in the West, parishes along the Princess Highway, Orbost to the East, Omeo to the North, and those parishes in South Gippsland. Our Diocesan Mission Council will be entrusted with the hopes and expectations of all of us in responding to the kind of Diocese Jesus calls us to be.

I ask for your prayerful support as we launch the work of the Diocesan Mission Council entrusting our intercession to Our Lady of Perpetual Help!



First Reading Is 5:1-7

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The vineyard of the Lord God of hosts is the House of Israel.

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes.

Why did it yield sour grapes instead?

Very well, I will tell you hat I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it.

Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 79:9. 12-16. 19-20. R. Is 5:7 (R.) The vineyard of the Lord is the House of Israel.

- You brought a vine out of Egypt; to plant it you drove out the nations. It stretched out its branches to the sea, to the Great River it stretched out its shoots. (R.)
- Then why have you broken down its walls?
 It is plucked by all who pass by.
 It is ravaged by the boar of the forest, devoured by the beasts of the field. (R.)
- God of hosts, turn again, we implore, look down from heaven and see.
 Visit this vine and protect it, the vine your right hand has planted. (R.)
- 4. And we shall never forsake you again: give us life that we may call upon your name. God of hosts, bring us back; let your face shine on us and we shall be saved. (R.)



Second Reading Phil 4:6-9

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians Do these things and the God of peace will be with you.

There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour, and everything that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise. Keep doing all the things that you learnt from me and have been taught by me and have heard or seen that I do. Then the God of peace will be with you.

Gospel Acclamation See Jn 15:15

Alleluia, alleluia! I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. Alleluia!

Gospel Mt 21:33-43

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *He leased his vineyard to other farmers.*

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vinevard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'
