

50t Anniversary

Of your ordination to the priesthood

This weekend we celebrate the 50th anniversary of Father Peter Bickley's ordination to the priesthood. Father Peter has worked in many parishes throughout our Diocese during his priesthood and we are looking forward to coming together from all corners to celebrate him this weekend.

He was ordained a priest in 1974 and celebrated his first mass at Sacred Heart in his home town of Morwell, surrounded by his family and friends. He began his journey of priesthood as an assistant priest here at St Michael's Traralgon until he moved to St Mary's Cathedral Sale in January 1979. There he became the Bishop's Secretary before moving to St Mary's Bairnsdale in 1984 to be their Assistant Priest. Later that year he moved to Orbost for his first placement as a Parish Priest, where he stayed until 1987, before moving to Lumen Christi Churchill where he was the Parish Priest until 1993. From there he became the Administrator at St Mary's Cathedral Sale, before moving back to St Michael's Traralgon to take on the role of Parish Priest where he stayed until 2011. From 2011-2016 he was the Parish Priest at St Mary's Bairnsdale, before returning to St Mary's Cathedral Sale as Dean of the Cathedral until his retirement in January 2022. After enjoying a full week of retirement, he was asked to look after the parishes of Leongatha and Korumburra which he quickly agreed to. It had only been a week, but he was already missing his flock.

Father Peter makes friends wherever he goes, and has been warmly welcomed throughout his parishes over the years, joining people of all ages and backgrounds together with song and faith, football and laughter.

Father Peter is well known for his pastoral care and love of the Geelong Football Club. He has always taken the time to be with his people and journey with them in good times and bad. He has celebrated many weddings, baptisms and funerals, often baptising the children of children he baptised. Even now in his 'retirement' he looks after parishes while parish priests are away, helps with funerals throughout the diocese and is often visiting parishioners at home, at hospital and in aged care. His love of his people and his dedication to his faith and his chosen vocation are an inspiration to us all and we are grateful for all he has done during his priesthood. We look forward to many more celebrations together.



A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

The Lord himself is God in heaven above and on earth below: there is no other.
