# **Ignite Youth Conference**

26 - 29 September 2024 Light of Christ Centre Waitara, NSW

Ignite Youth is hosting its annual youth conference in Sydney from September 26-29. The theme of this year's conference is Rise Up! Like the phoenix from the ashes, to ascend in the power of the Holy Spirit. To hold on to Jesus and the hope of his words when he says, "I am the resurrection and the life, whoever believes in me will live forever..." (John 11:25)

Last year we had 11 parishioners attend and come back full of hope for our church and our parish after spending four days with other young people from around Australia, sharing their faith and strengthening their relationship with God and each other. One of our J-Walkers summarised their experience of last year's Ignite Youth Conference: 'In addition to reflection and supplication, we had groups of the youth council members praying for guidance and strength to carry out the teaching and experiences learnt in our every lives. When we gathered as a group to reflect and pray, we gave ourselves the opportunity to process what we have learnt and experienced. We shared our insights, struggles and victories and this is where the true magic happened, as we encouraged, supported and challenged one another to grow in faith. It was also in these moments of reflection and prayer that we built the strong bonds of fellowship that made this conference so special." We have seen the fruits of last year's conference in the deepened faith and connections between our J-Walkers.

Ignite provides a safe and supportive environment for young people to explore and grow their faith, it is a national catholic conference with something for everyone. This is the Church gathered and alive on mission, God's people united with one heart. It is a gathering of Catholics for four days of real-world formation, renewal of faith, great people and powerful worship. Inspiring guest speakers will host workshops on leadership, worship, mission, culture and discipleship with music from Emmanuel Worship.

We will be using funds raised from the Coffee Cart to support the costs of attending the conference and will also have two fundraising days on Sunday July 21 and Sunday August 18 in the Mary MacKillop Hall. to those who experienced Ignite 23 and how it has supported and inspired their faith journey. We are grateful for your ongoing support of our Youth Ministry and look forward to your continued support as we journey towards Ignite 24, Rise Up!





Ez 17:22-24

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I have made the small tree great.

The Lord says this:

`From the top of the cedar, from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain.

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight – we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

#### Gospel

Mk 4:26-34

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
