PARISH HALL START DATE MONDAY JULY 15!


It is finally happening! After many years and challenges, our parish hall project is moving forward and will begin on Monday July 15. Langden Constructions will take over the parish centre at this time to begin the demolotion of the old outbuildings before beginning the construction of our new hall. You will soon see temporary fencing placed around the parish centre, however access to the church will remain the same.

Drawings are available in both church foyers and we encourage you to have a look at the improvements being made to our old Presbytery. We are removing extra bedrooms and bathrooms to make space for the new hall and updating the office space to make it more user friendly and fit for purpose.

During the build process we will not have access to the parish centre at all, nor to the Mary MacKillop Room or the Chapel. Our parish office will be closed and our staff mostly working from home, however we will still be available Tuesday to Friday from 9am – 4pm via phone and email. Our staff will be available at the St Vincent de Paul Centre on Tuesdays from 9am – 4pm, please call or email to make an appointment. Parish meetings will need to be held elsewhere so please contact the office to arrange a space and time for your group to meet. As the Adoration Chapel will be closed after the 15th, you are invited to join us for a final prayer service in the chapel on Sunday July 13 at 10am.

There will also be garage sale held in and about the Mary MacKillop Room on Sunday July 13 where you are invited to take anything that interests you, for a donation to the church. We have a lot of kitchen items, tables, chairs, lamps, pictures, office equipment, glassware and books that we don't have room to store and are in need of a new loving home. You are also welcome to pop into the parish office during the week if you would like to have a look and buy anything before then.

We thank you in advance for your patience during this time. It is very exciting that the build is finally happening but we understand that it will be difficult to be without a parish office for awhile. At this stage, the build is due for completion on March 15, 2025. We will keep you updated on our movements as things change and look forward to soon being together in our very own Parish Hall.



About this thing, I have pleaded with the Lord three times for it to leave me, but he has said, 'My grace is enough for you: my power is at its best in weakness.' So I shall be very happy to make my weaknesses my special boast so that the power of Christ may stay over me, and that is why I am quite content with my weaknesses, with hardships, and insults, persecutions, and the agonies I go through for Christ's sake. For it is when I am weak that I am strong.

They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.
